Core Beliefs About Rigor and Remote Learning

- 1. Remote learning uses best practices in instruction but adapts them to a virtual setting (entire book).
- 2. Remote learning should provide opportunities for student engagement, although it may look different from the physical classroom (entire book).
- 3. Blending synchronous and asynchronous learning will likely be the best way to support your instruction (entire book).
- 4. Planning ensures you can accomplish your goals with rigorous remote learning (Chapter 2).
- 5. Expectations for learning should be high in terms of content, not just technology or creativity (Chapters 3 and 5).
- 6. Scaffolding and support are key to student success. Scaffolding may occur with the whole class, small groups or individuals (Chapter 4).
- 7. Allowing for different assessment options, including an emphasis on performance-based assessment, is important, since traditional assessment methods may not be as effective in a remote learning setting (Chapter 6).
- 8. Partnering with parents and families is critical to ensure student success (Chapter 7).
